NEF provides education opportunities designed for the construction industry for anyone interested in certifications in different fields of construction. They also provide educational tools and programs for K-12 and college students. Every year our chapter donates \$2,500 to NEF along with other chapters throughout the association who donate whatever they have budgeted. - Build a scale model using recycled materials
- Record a short video to showcase their future city
- Answer questions about their city from a panel of technical judges

## SCR Fall Conference 2021 – New Orleans, LA

Fall Conference 2021 was Director Rhonda Nebgen's first official regional event. The Ft Worth chapter was well represented by President Riley Seahorn, President-Elect Karen Weatherford, Vice President Megan Shaw, Secretary Shelie Murphy and student member Adama Ba. There was a total of 46 in attendance.

The opening day included registration and plan reading 101, followed by the President's Meeting and First Timer Meeting. To cap off the official events for the day a networking, industry appreciation and welcome mixer was held with the theme of "Friday Night Lights". Of course, Riley attended the President's Meeting and learned of Director Nebgen's regional goals. Megan Shaw and Adama Ba attended the First Timer's meeting and participated in the ice-breaker game (coming in 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> place). Shelie Murphy, as part of the regional conference team, and Karen Weatherford, both helped with conference registration and check-in. Following the mixer, we went to dinner on Bourbon Street and bonded as a team, trying new foods, drink and learning more about our members.

Plan reading 101 presented by Billy Joe Arie, was a good low-level overview of this history of "blueprints" and how to read plans across the various sectors. Focusing on commercial but also residential construction.

On Saturday, the "official" meeting was called to order, with Director Nebgen presiding. Shelie Murphy did an awesome, tough job of registration reporting. We had representatives from the National office -Crissy Ingram - Executive Director and Amber Kohut – Membership Coordinator, National President- Doreen Bartoldus, National President Elect – Lauline Mitchell, National Vice President – Karen Hager, and National Treasurer – Jessica Huff. We received a Welcome to New Orleans and learned about the infrastructure projects they have recently completed, have ongoing and upcoming plans from Sarah McLaughlin Porteus. Most of the projects focus on preventing flooding on this sub-sea elevation area.

Karen Hagar, current National Vice President, officially announced her candidacy for National President Elect. Next, they covered actions by the Board both Pre-Annual Conference and post-Annual Conference, these have been communicated by National over the past few months. Due to some committee chairs not being able to attend, we received a brief update from Membership, By Laws, Strategic Planning, Block Kids, Design Drafting, NEF and the NFSF representatives.

Breakout sessions were held. One was NAWIC 101. Megan and Adama attended this session. Riley and I attended the NAWIC Intermediate session which talked about the Secretary, Treasurer and Director roles of a chapter, as well as standing committees' responsibilities. Shelie Murphy attended the NAWIC Leadership session which was discussing how to pursue regional and national leadership roles.

A box lunch was served while we heard from Erica Brandon from Vulcraft. She told us about her journey to where she is now as a designer/drafter with Vulcraft.

After lunch we reconvened to talk about upcoming important dates, adopted the region budget and SOX region policies, and had an invite from the Little Rock chapter for Fall Conference 2023. Key upcoming regional dates include: Forum 2022 in Oklahoma City 4/7-4/9, Fall Conference 2022 in Waco 10/21-10/22, Forum 2023 in Ft Worth 4/14-4/15. More details to follow.

Next, we heard from industry experts about the current material supply and pricing situations. Lauline Mitchell (National President Elect and Conf Representative) moderated the panel discussion by Christina Duffek of Hull Supply, Josh Dellinger of Steel-Fab and Doreen Bartoldus of Jacobs Hampton Bays (current National President). Overall consensus was that market volatility is here to stay for another 6 to 9 months, and they don't expect price decrease for until mid to late 2023, as if demand continues, the market will bear the ridiculous price increases. We did have some region and NFSF raffles but no chapter sales or NEF raffles as we normally see. The Ft Worth chapter brought back some ideas for Forum 2023, possible activities for our chapter and opportunities to grow and maintain our membership. Networking and meeting new members were as always so beneficial.



- D. Applicant must have a current cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher to be considered for awards.

Applicant is responsible for ensuring that all items listed below are submitted to the Foundation via email and received no later than 30 days prior to the next academic year/semester, **or as otherwise specified by the foundation for the applicable semester (see cover letter).**

Please attach in the order shown below:

- A. Completed and signed application form.
- B. Transcript of grades for three most recent semesters.
- C. Employment history (limit to one page).
- D. Community/Campus involvement (limit to one page).
- E. Essay questions (limit to one page).

### AWARDS

- A. Applications will be reviewed and winners selected by the NAWIC Fort Worth Chapter #1 Foundation Awards Committee. The committee will consider applicant's interest in construction, grades and employment.
- B. All applicants will be notified of their status after the Awards Committee meeting no later than 30 days prior to the next academic year/semester, **or as otherwise specified by the board for the applicable semester (see cover letter).**
- C. Applicants selected will be subject to a personal interview with a representative of the NAWIC Fort Worth Chapter #1 Foundation.
- D. Proof of matriculation for the next school term, and other information as designated by the Foundation, must be received by the timeline specified by the board without exception.
- E. Checks will be sent directly to the institution in accordance with the institution's applicable requirements and timeline.
