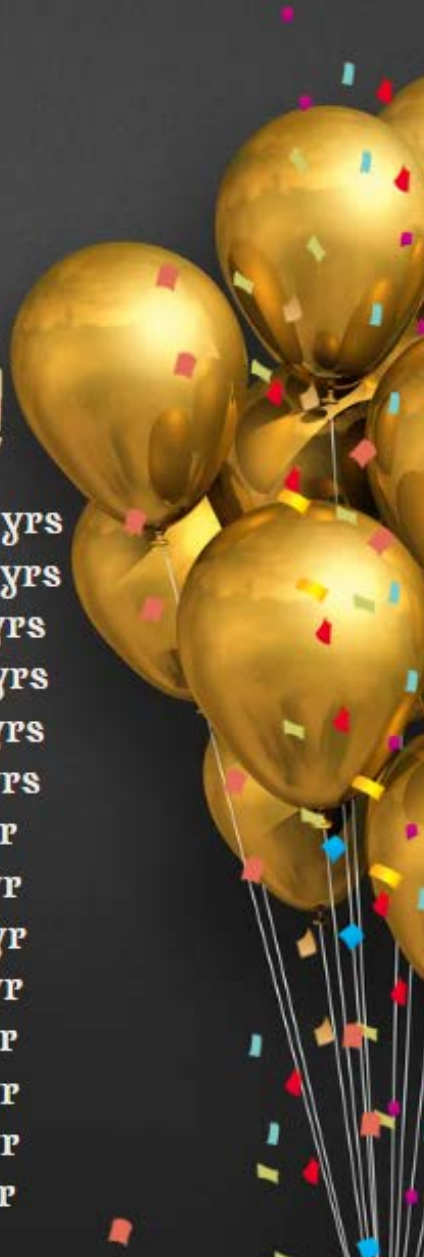

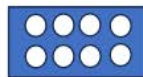

Competition Guidelines

A minimum of 75 blocks is required with a maximum of 100 blocks.

Each participant may also use up to three of the items listed below when provided by the sponsor.

- o Small rock/stone not more than two (2) inches in diameter
- o String not longer than twelve (12) inches in length
- o Foil not larger than 18 inches x 18 inches*
- o Poster Board – not larger than 18 inches x 18 inches*
*Each of these items may be broken or torn into smaller pieces, provided the child does so without outside assistance. The use of scissors or knives are prohibited.

All participants are given 40 – 60 minutes to complete the project.

A qualified project is one that is construction-related. Each student will meet with a judge or judges who will rate the project and ask the student a series of questions.

There will be 1st Place, 2nd Place, and 3rd Place Trophies and Prizes

All nomination forms received prior to the deadline will be numbered and reviewed for anonymity (no names or chapter numbers) and forwarded to a panel of judges, as selected by the Award's Chair or Region Director. Member's name or chapter shall not be referenced in the essay.

Criteria and Method of Judging: Information shall be based upon the period of October 1st through September 30th of the prior NAWIC year:

- All nominees must be a member in good standing.
- Nominee must have maintained continuous membership for the past fifteen (15) years or more.

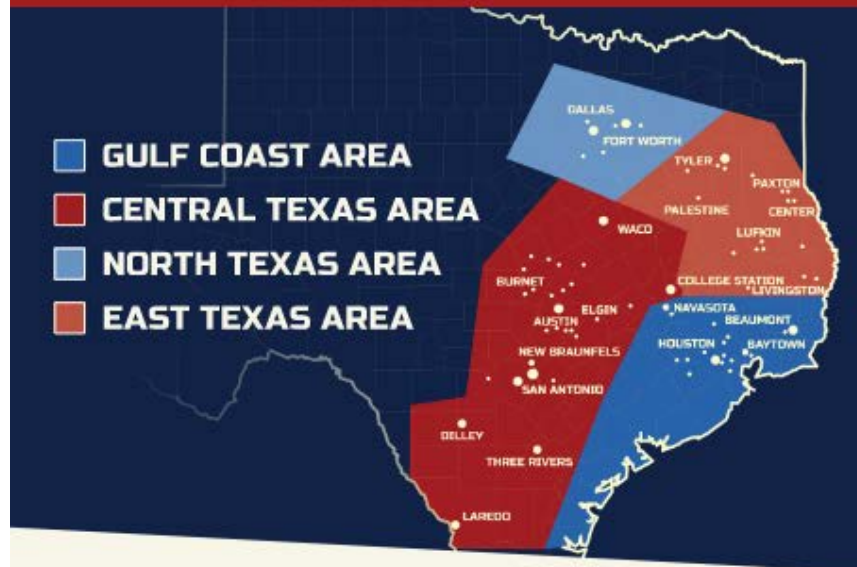
